

## FELLOWSHIP GROUP

Whatever the winter throws at you we hope that you and yours and your homes come out the other side 'a' okay. Our thoughts and prayers go out to those unfortunates who have suffered, and are still suffering, from the ferocity of the storms and subsequent destructive flooding. May they receive all the help and assistance, physical, mental and financial, they require to restore their lives and homes.

FUNDRAISING: Once again with your marvellous support, we had a very successful Christmas Sale and Coffee Morning in November, raising the sum of £1,400.67p. Our group work very hard to produce items which we hope will appeal, and the above total proved us right.

Thank you ladies of the Group, thank you supporters for your loyalty, and last but by no means least, thanks to our 'band of helpers' who work their socks off and enjoy doing so.

EXPENDITURE: £755.13p. Our main financial outlay in 2019 was the deep cleaning of the Church after redecoration which was surprisingly low at £360, the next was Abbas Rest Orphanages to which we donated £250, the remainder was spent on craft items, camouflage net for the revamped poppy fall for Remembrance Sunday, petrol for the mower, items for the kitchen and a gratuity. Regarding the donation to ARO. I had an email from the treasurer, who had just returned home from a meeting where they had been discussing a project in Malawi which would require £1000, money which they did not have. Upon closing the meeting, they agreed that the Lord would provide. The first thing she did was to open her emails, and there was our offer of £250. Food for thought? I leave it with you.

It would be very nice indeed to see you some Thursday morning, if you are at a loose end, Church Centre, between 10am and 12noon. You don't have to knit or be 'crafty', just come along for cuppa, a natter and a laugh - we are good at that - you will be made very welcome.

## **CHURCHES TOGETHER**

There have been two main events under the “ Dalbeattie Churches Together” banner since the last edition of the magazine. The first of these was the Lantern Walk which took place in Dalbeattie Town Wood on Sunday 16 December. About 150 gathered as dusk fell and followed the lighted trail to the gathering point in the woods where a short carol service was held before completing the circuit back to the car park. Here, members of the Galloway Christian Centre had laid on refreshments and festive fare, the enjoyment of which was a little hampered by the rain which had accompanied the second part of the walk. An atmospheric, convivial evening of united worship. The second coming together of the churches this year took place on the afternoon of Sunday 9 February in the Lesser Town Hall and, in anticipation of St. Valentine’s Day, took as its theme the Celebration of Christian Love. There were 60 in attendance with all local clergy contributing to the service, the centre-piece of which was a reflection by Rev. Oonagh Dee on the unconditional love which lies at the heart of the story of the Prodigal Son. The organising group behind Churches Together took the decision at the start of this calendar year to discontinue the programme of monthly Sunday evening services. This was done partly in recognition of the disincentives which exist in the prospect of coming out on a winter’s evening but also partly on the grounds that, over the past two years, these services have fulfilled their objective of bringing people of all denominations together in different settings and in differing forms of worship. The alternative approach will be to organise four joint services over the course of the year timed to celebrate the changing of the seasons. Keep at least one ear open for the intimation of these and at least one eye open for the published notices.

### **Painting of the Inner Walls of the Church**

The painting of the wall of the church was quite an operation. The biggest job was getting scaffolding in place so that the painter could reach all parts of the walls. All the scaffolding had to be carried in by hand.

The arch way above the chancel was very difficult to reach and needed four levels of scaffold to reach the top and also had to be wide enough to reach under the arch. The scaffolding had then to be dismantled and taken out by hand.

# giftaid it

Gift Aid is good news for the Church:

- ✓ It increases our giving by 25%
- ✓ No minimum contribution is required
- ✓ No particular amount has to be promised
- ✓ There is no fixed term during which contributions must be made
- ✓ Tax may be recovered retrospectively.

All that is required is that the donor must pay UK income tax or capital gains tax, at any rate, at least equal to the amount of tax being reclaimed, and give their offering or donation through offering envelopes or by bank standing order or by cheque to establish the necessary audit trail.

Donors must also sign a Gift Aid declaration form, which gives the name of the congregation and the donor's name and address (including postcode).

The easiest way for the Church to increase funds is through Gift Aid. If you give £1.00, the Church receives 25p. Many people give through Bank Standing Orders that can either be monthly, quarterly or annually. You can also change the regular amount you are giving. Last year Dalbeattie & Kirkgunzeon Church were able to claim back £ 7234 which is a great help towards much needed funds.

Please get in touch if you would like a Gift Aid declaration form and whether you would prefer to donate using Gift Aid envelopes, bank standing order, or cheque. I can also give you a form for arranging a standing order with your bank. 
